Behold, O Lord, I Come To Do Your Will

Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father's house to a land that I will show you..." You may have wondered, or perhaps experienced first-hand in one way or another, how the venerable Patriarch Abraham felt when, at seventy five years of age, he received the call from God to leave his homeland. Well, our Sr. Catherine Marie now has a deeper identification with Abraham as she herself responds to a radical call from God, after having lived in St. Joseph Monastery in her home state of Kentucky for fifty-seven years. The "call" came earlier this year, in the form of a request from a delegate from the Holy See that she accept a temporary assignment as Superior of the Monastero/Santuario di Santa Gemma in Lucca, Italy, four hours north of Rome. This appointment comes as part of the work the Passionist Nuns throughout the world have undertaken under the direction of the Holy See, to unite in a new structure of communion which is called a monastic congregation, The Congregation of the Nuns of the Passion of Jesus Christ.

Although this new assignment was admittedly shocking at first, the Will of God was manifest with great clarity. So after much prayer and discernment, and after requesting provisions for a few practical details (such as a translator; Sr. Catherine Marie speaks very little Italian!), our Sister accepted, with the full support of Mother John Mary and our whole community.

We feel humbly honored that the Holy See has asked us to take a more immediate part in helping another monastery of Passionist Nuns.

And so it is that Mother Catherine Marie arrived in Lucca on June 17. With joyful and courageous dependence upon Our Lord, notwithstanding the heat of the Mediterranean summer as well as the language barrier, she is doing what she can to be a true "Madre" to the small Lucca community of Passionist

Nuns.

The community in Lucca has a number of elderly and sick religious, along with four Indonesian Nuns and two from France. The shrine of St. Gemma, attached to the monastery, is a popular pilgrimage site with a neverending stream of pilgrims. This presents many challenges as the Nuns strive to maintain their Passionist contemplative life while exercising a limited hospitality to the pilgrims.

Of course, we have not left our Sister alone in her new mission. We accompany her with our prayers every step of the way (as have so many of you!). Our Sr. Mary Agnes, accompanied by Jane Wynn, the mother of our Sr. Cecilia Maria, also traveled to Lucca in late July. They brought Mother Catherine Marie the support of some familiar faces and put their tech-savvy heads together to

solve some major technological problems which Mother has encountered in the Lucca monastery. Sr. Mary Agnes will remain in Lucca until the end of August. A Saint of the Passionist Congregation

St. Gemma Galgani was an Italian mystic, known for her devotion to the Passion of Christ. Born in 1878, her short life of twenty-five years was marked by tremendous physical and spiritual suffering, but also profound union with Christ Crucified and many extraordinary mystical experiences. At the age of twenty-one, she received the stigmata, the marks of Christ's wounds imprinted on her own body. Although Gemma desired to become a Passionist Nun, she was not permitted due to her poor health and her mystical experiences, and therefore lived a life of prayer and penance as a laywoman. Gemma died of tuberculosis on April 11, 1903, in Lucca, Italy, and her relics are enshrined in that same town at the Passionist Monastery and International Shrine of St. Gemma.


Lord, Send Laborers For the Harvest!




